

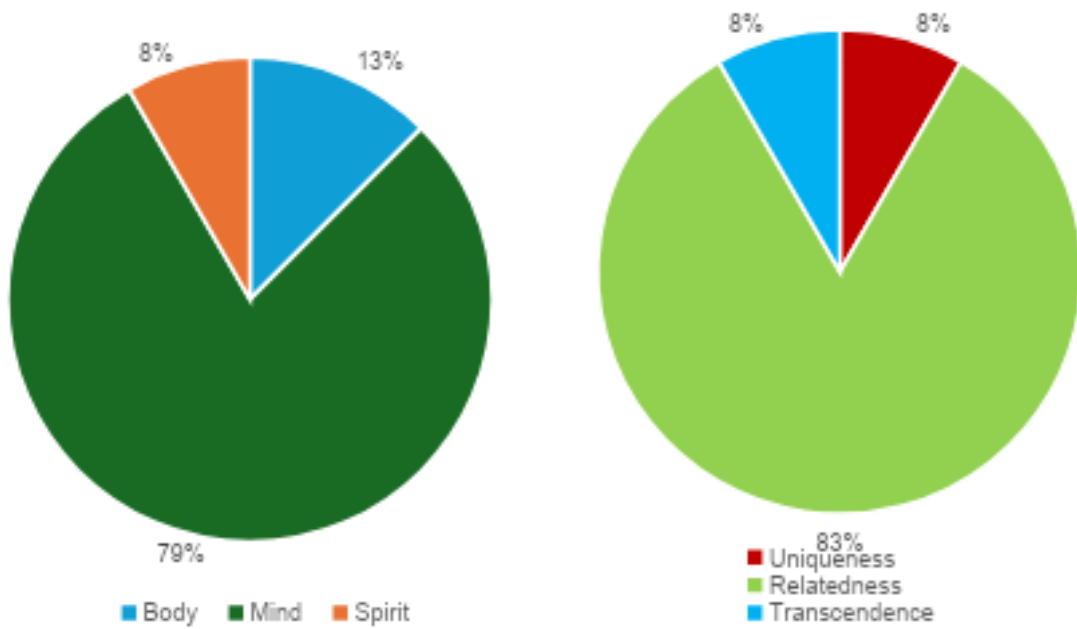

Unfortunately, very little information on the website makes it hard to evaluate. Although very friendly in their replies, they were mostly limited to repeating what the website provided. Again, it appears to be a program mainly focused on fulfilling Oregon's guidelines. Psilocybin focus. Its brochure mentions all the expected categories, but little elaboration on its content exists. It has an *accelerated* training that gets you *ready* in 8 weeks (that is a bit of a red light to me). I could not find any emphasis on self-exploration / intrapersonal, spirituality/ transformation, or indigenous practices. No mention of experientials. Their emphasis on practicum is a saving grace, but for now, it is limited to breathwork (this will most likely change as things evolve in Oregon). Again, not much to work with. UR Dominance.
